



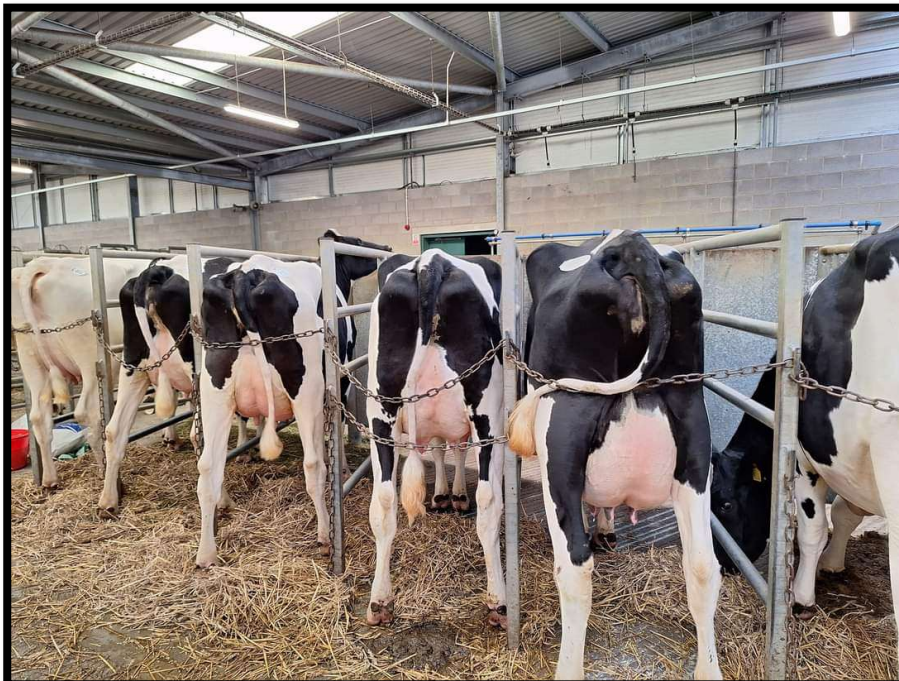

Trade was certainly back on the week as were numbers in anticipation of the Show & Sale next week. As always quality always sells and the top calls were the same as the past few weeks. It was a super milky second calver from Millenheath Farms Ltd, Prees Millenheath Flex Lila calved a month and at 46kg this second calver had given close to 9000kg last lactation and looked to top that this time she was closely followed by her herd mate of similar type and age making £2400 she was giving 51kg. Also of mention was Wolston Agronaut Duchess 18 a 4th calver calved 11 days having given 10000kg last time she sold for £2100. A super 3rd calved Ayrshire cow from Messrs Albert, Beeline Santa Lilac giving 32kg she made £1750. Also, a group of 6 milky Brown Swiss cross cows from regular vendors H Davies, Puddington averaged £1350 today.

Onto the heifers and a top shout today of £2600 went once again to WA Jones, Fennsbank with Fennshall Sedona Ivory calved a couple of weeks, there second heifer of the run made £2580 for Fennshall Sedona Annette calved just a couple of weeks and already at 38kg!

Also near the top prices today was AD & RM Thomas, Lutterworth with Wolston Dreambig Glace 88 again fresh a couple of weeks she made £2400. Very closely followed by Meldamar Redcarpet Lady Ruth 212, this Westcoast Redcarpet daughter made £2380. The Albert family brought forward a very tidy and milky Jersey heifer Wyreforest Devinci Rosie she had oceans of milk behind her and was already at 25kg 10 days calved. She sold for £1320. It should be noted that there were 3 ¾ or light quartered heifers in today which are as always included in the averages they topped at £1250.

Already there are entries coming in the the August Show & Sale supported by the Shropshire Holstein Club for the Styche Trophy and expected entries of 50 in this sale alone. Also, a group of youngstock from the noted Meldamar herd following the Show & Sale as well as a polled Hereford Stock Bull from the Brassingtons, Roden.

The day will build for the Shrewsbury Highlight Sale which will contain star lots in all age groups from milkers to calves and a Stock Bull from noted herds nationally Styche, Millenheath, Panda, Starlet, Bronlyn, Nobold, Knowlesmere, Sweetpea, Ashacres.

Steady Trade for Barren Cows at Shrewsbury Auction Centre – 13th August 2024

The Shrewsbury Auction Centre saw a solid trade for barren cows on the 13th of August, with an increased

entry of 14 cows compared to previous weeks. While the overall averages reflected a slight softening in the market, the demand for quality, well-finished cows remained robust, with several standout prices achieved.

D & P Nicholas led the sale and presented a pair of impressive Aberdeen Angus cross cows. The day's top price was £1,640 for a 25-month-old cow weighing 704 kgs, closely followed by another Aberdeen Angus cross from the same vendor at £1,625, weighing 710 kgs. These prices underscore the continued buyer interest in younger, well-muscled cattle, consistently commanding premium prices.

D & P Nicholas also achieved a strong result with a 26-month-old Friesian cow weighing 666 kg, which sold for £1,451. This further highlights the demand for quality dairy breeds in good condition. Other notable prices included a 169-month-old Friesian cow from JA Roberts, which weighed 724 kgs and sold for £1,194, and a 148-month-old Friesian cow from SE Roberts, weighing 655 kgs, which fetched £1,080. These prices demonstrate that even older cows can secure solid returns when presented in good condition.

R & J Hill's Simental cross cow, aged 42 months and weighing 560 kgs, sold for £1,008, reflecting the sustained demand for continental breeds despite the overall market dip.

The average price per kilogram was 159ppk, with an overall average price per head of £976. Both figures represent a decrease from the previous week, indicating some market pressure. However, the increase in the number of cows sold—up by two from last week and ten compared to a fortnight ago—suggests that sellers are responding to market opportunities, and buyers are still keen to secure quality stock.

Despite the slight average downturn, the market for barren cows at Shrewsbury Auction Centre remains steady, with well-finished cows attracting strong competition among buyers. The results from this week's sale reinforce the importance of bringing quality stock to the auction, as those presenting cows in prime condition consistently achieve the best prices.

The overall stamp of calves presented today would not quite be up to last weeks but still a very firm trade throughout. A few stronger " month old types on offer sold to a top of £520 for a smart Simmental bull from John Phillips with second spot selling to £510 for a fantastic blue bull

from TA Wainwright. Some lovely Limousin heifers sold to £495 on three occasions from John Phillips with others to £450. Plenty of spirited demand for the stronger sorts. Of the younger fresher sorts, Richard Bowdler led the way with a lovely blue bull at £442 with Ms Wilson, Church farm close behind at £390, with plenty £380+. Blue bulls averaged £315 all through. Young Simmentals topped at £272 with the best of the Herefords to a staggering £430 from Cenfoed Farms. Friesians remain a sensational trade and possibly the dearest calves in the market, topping at £265 and the entire entry averaging £129, with a bottom price of £38. Heifers another great trade with Blues to £440 from TA Wainwright and MW & JM Trevor-Jones selling their lovely sort to £415. GP & JH Mountford sold their usual stamp to £316 with Richard Bowdler in hot pursuit at £312. Angus heifers topped at £230, smart Lims from Jim Corfield to £265, with Herefords to £200.

Cautious Yet Competitive: Consistent Trade at Shrewsbury Auction Centre

The market at Shrewsbury Auction Centre on August 13th showcased a steady trade, with clear preferences emerging among buyers. While there was solid demand overall, the market revealed a distinct challenge in selling leaner lambs, with well-meated lambs carrying weight in much higher demand.

The average price per kilogram across all lambs was 293ppk, with the Standard Quality Quotation (SQQ) slightly higher at 295ppk. These figures highlight a stable market, but they also underscore the selective nature of buyer interest. Leaner lambs struggled to attract top bids, with buyers increasingly focused on heavier, well-fleshed lambs that promise better yields.

In the 25.5 to 32 kg range, AW Jones secured a top price of 297ppk, with the highest price per head at £95. However, the average for this group stood at 277ppk, reflecting the difficulty in selling lighter, leaner lambs. Buyers were more discerning, often passing over leaner options, favouring those with better conformation and meat cover.

The 32.1 to 39 kg category saw stronger bidding, particularly for well-meated lambs. G Briggs & Son peaked at 314ppk, with GM Brown reaching £116 per head. This group's average price per kilogram was 298ppk, showing that mid-weight lambs with good finish attracted the most interest. The demand here was noticeably higher for lambs that carried weight and presented a well-rounded carcass.

For lambs weighing 39.1 to 45.5 kg, KH & RHO Harding led with a top price of 311ppk, while AR & LJ Tudor attained £138 per head. The average price of 292ppk in this category reflected steady demand, particularly for those lambs with good meat coverage. Buyers were willing to pay a premium for lambs that offered more substance, while leaner offerings saw less enthusiasm.

The 45.6 to 52 kg category achieved the highest average price per kilogram at 302ppk, with KH & RHO Harding again topping the charts at 318 ppk and £158 per head. This category highlighted the market's preference, with well-finished, heavier lambs commanding the best prices. There was a clear willingness to pay for quality, with weight and meatiness driving buyer interest.

In the heaviest category, 52 kg and above, JM Carlyle peaked at 302ppk, and RS & JA Gregory secured the highest price per head at £175. While the average price of 271ppk was lower, well-meated lambs still performed better than their leaner counterparts, which struggled to compete in this weight range.

Overall, the market at Shrewsbury Auction Centre reflected strong demand for well-meated, heavier lambs, with leaner lambs finding it harder to attract competitive bids. The emphasis on weight and meatiness was evident across all categories, as buyers clearly preferred lambs that promise better returns. As we move into the season, it will be important to note how these preferences shape the market and influence pricing trends.

Strong Demand for Cull Ewes and Rams at Shrewsbury Auction Centre.

The market for cull rams remained steady, with 14 rams going under the hammer, a slight decrease of 5 from the previous week. The average price held firm at £115, consistent with last week's results. N & K Unwin achieved the highest price in this category, securing £205 for their top ram. RT Edwards & Son also performed well, with their rams reaching £162 and £143, while NE & JA Gibbs saw top prices of £150.50 and £140. These strong results for cull rams indicate a stable market where well-finished rams can still command excellent prices.

The outcomes from this week's sale underline the importance of bringing well-prepared, quality livestock to market. Sellers who presented big, meaty ewes and rams saw the most competitive bidding, reinforcing the value of investing in the finish and condition of stock before sale. Cows & Calves

The sale of cows and calves at Shrewsbury Auction Centre on 13th August 2024 was marked by strong demand and impressive prices. Six lots were presented, averaging £1,623 per head. Anglo Welsh Trading led the sale, with their top Aberdeen Angus X cow and calf fetching £1,860, and other entries from the same vendor selling between £1,500 and £1,700. A Friesian cow and calf from Sunnyside Farm LTD also performed well, achieving £1,400. The consistent prices across this category underscore the quality of the livestock and the strength of the market.

Weanlings

The weanling heifer's category was a key feature of the sale, with 49 lots presented and an average price of £700 per head. This segment demonstrated robust buyer interest, particularly for British Blue and Limousin crosses, which continue to be highly sought after due to their desirable characteristics. The top price in this category was £1,140 for a 13-month-old British Blue X heifer from CG & SR Davies, highlighting the strong demand for this breed.

Limousin X heifers also fetched impressive prices, with a 14-month-old heifer from KM Croft selling for £1,125. This solid performance was further underscored by several other Limousin X heifers, including an 11-month-old Saler heifer from TS Davies that achieved £1,075, and a 10-month-old Limousin X heifer from the same vendor that sold for £940.

The range of prices for weanling heifers illustrates the varied preferences among buyers, with many willing to pay a premium for breeds known for their growth rates, meat quality, and market adaptability. Other top lots included a 12-month-old Limousin X heifer that sold for £860 from SH Hillage & Sons and a 10-month-old British Blue X heifer at £820 from HJ Morgan & Son, demonstrated the consistent interest in these crosses. The competitive bidding in this category reflects the broader market's confidence in the future performance of these heifers, whether for breeding or finishing purposes.

The weanling steers category stood out as one of the strongest segments of the sale, with 16 lots sold at an average price of £868 per head. The highest price was a remarkable £1,250 for a 14-month-old Limousin X steer from KM Croft, setting the benchmark for quality in this category. This result was closely followed by two other Limousin X steers from the same vendor, which sold for £1,200 and £1,155, respectively. These prices underscore the significant demand for Limousin steers, which are favoured for their excellent growth rates, muscular development, and high retail value.

In addition to the Limousin entries, other breeds also commanded strong prices. A 10-month-old Saler steer from TS Davies fetched £1,060, reflecting the breed's

growing popularity due to its robustness and adaptability. Similarly, a 16-month-old Aberdeen Angus X steer from SH & JRF Gwyther sold for £1,015, further highlighting the diverse buyer interest in quality steers.

The weanling steers revealed a clear market trend where buyers are willing to invest significantly in breeds with proven performance and return on investment. A 14-month-old Limousin X steer from WJ Roberts & Co that sold for £885, the market remained strong, indicating that quality stock continues to attract attention and competitive bids. The results from this category suggest a healthy and confident market, with buyers focusing on securing premium steers that offer strong growth potential.

The weanling bull's category, though smaller, saw solid performance with four lots averaging £503 per head. The top price in this category was £620 for a 14-month-old South Devon X bull from D Stanhope. Another South Devon X bull, aged 7 months, sold for £500. A 3-month-old Aberdeen Angus X bull from AD & RM Thomas fetched £390. Despite the limited number of entries, the prices achieved indicate steady demand for well-bred bulls.

The sale at Shrewsbury Auction Centre on 13th August 2024 was highly successful, with strong prices across all categories. The cows and calves' section was particularly robust, with Anglo Welsh Trading's AAX entries leading the way. Weanling heifers and steers also performed exceptionally well, with British Blue and Limousin crosses commanding top prices. The market for weanling bulls, though smaller, was steady, with solid prices achieved for South Devon and Aberdeen Angus crosses. These results indicate a confident market, with strong demand driving robust prices across all categories, ensuring sellers are well-rewarded for their quality livestock.

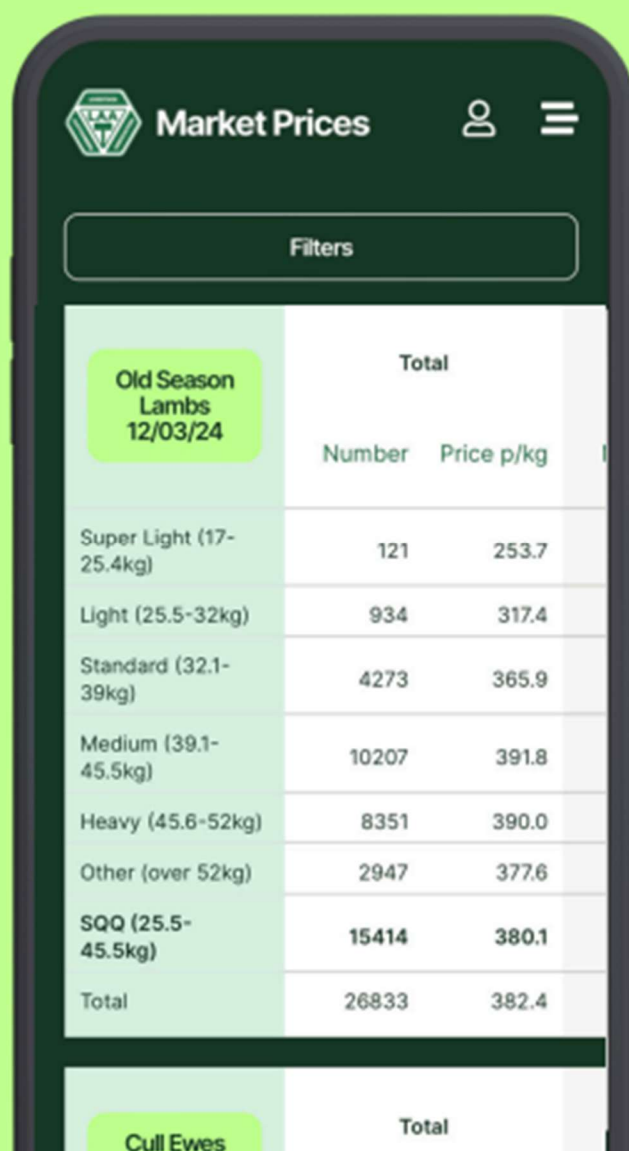
