Cows were topped at £2450 for **THISTLEROSE RUBI ZANDRA vg85 – 2yr**, she was from the great family and giving 42kg per day, a pair of medium sized cows giving in the mid to late 30's from DH & JE Morgan sold well at £1750 (2).

The heifer lineup was very high quality with a couple that really took a buyer's eye. The top price was £3100 for **WOLSTON CHIEF LAVENDER 68** from AD & RM Thomas, Lutterworth this classy heifer was giving 34kg per day. Next at £2700 for **NOLBOLD TLC SUMMERFEST ARIEL** From mike Roberts giving an impressive 35kg she achieved £2700, a belter from JB & J Cambridge, **JAYBURN DREAMBIG DAPHNE** also giving 35kg sold for £2600. All the well balance Holstein types sold for £1900 or more. A couple Friesian and Fleckveih heifers undoubtedly looked good value for the right purchaser £1000-£1200!!

A run of pedigree bulling heifers from JGP Lewis & Co from Aberystwyth drew customers to the ringside and online, bred using top bulls and out of classified dams from their Ystwyth Herd. They peaked at £1060 (3) for 3 daughters of Westcoat Swingman.

Young Heifers of the Fleck X Variety topped at 342ppk / £2,093.04 from H. Davies & Partners, Manor House Farm.

Steers topped at 327ppk / £2,001.24 for a 22month old weighty Friesian steer from J. T. & B. P. Thomas, Micklewood.

Fantastic numbers forward this week and the trade just keeps on giving! Charolais bulls headed the day today with Will Davies selling his fine 30-day calf at £800. Blue Bulls were simply electric with the 47 on offer averaging a staggering £589, topping at £755 from TA Wainwright and also Bowdler Farms, with 10 selling in excess of £700. Simmental bulls sold to £580 from CJ

Tams, While Jim Corfield sold his Limousin Bulls to top at £670. Natives were just as dear with the best of the Angus to £550 from Roger Ainsworth with Herefords to £542 from the same home. Friesians a proper trade topping at £260 for square types from PB Sutton with several others over £200, returning an average of £131.

Heifers again showing no let-up in trade selling to £610 for Charolais again from Will Davies while smart Blues from Richard Bowdler sold to £585 and to £560 from Bowdler Farms, with all blue females averaging £481. Hereford Heifers from Helen Stubbs to £440 with Angus to the same price from George Davies. A nice run of young Limousin heifers traded to £475 from John Phillips. A good entry of stronger weaned sorts on offer today also saw Blue Bulls at 5m to £820 on two occasions from Dave Evans, while John Phillips sold his trio of Lim bulls at 3m to £800 and £765. Blue heifers at the same age to £820 and £780 with Lim heifers to £800 again at 3m.

Well, what a difference a week makes! After last Tuesday's larger show of just over 1,000 hogs, we had a much smaller but well-finished entry of 619 this week—and to be honest, the trade felt sharper from the off.

We've seen a bit of a steadier tone return to the ring, especially for the better-fed hogs with a bit of shape and cover. Buyers were selective as ever, but when the hogs ticked the boxes, the prices certainly followed.



Starting with the lightweights (25.5–32kg), we had 54 through, averaging 268p/kg, with a top of 298p/kg and £95.50 per head from J Pugh Ltd. That's back slightly on the average from last week, but to be fair, numbers were tighter and demand held for the well-shaped, neat sorts.

The standard weights (32.1–39kg) saw a good run of 183 hogs, with an average of 292p/kg, topped at 322p/kg and £122.50—again by J Pugh Ltd. While that's a bit off last week's highs (top of 338p/kg), it's still a very respectable trade, with the better hogs more than holding their ground.

The mediums (39.1–45.5kg) had a cracking trade, averaging 297p/kg—a lift on last week's 292p/kg. Top price on the day went to N Griffiths at 338p/kg, with EG Norris topping the section on the scales at £146. The ring was certainly alive for those strong, square hogs with a bit of cover on them.

Moving into the heavier hogs (45.6–52kg), we had 155 head, averaging 293p/kg, which is just a smidge under last week, but still very good going. Top pen per kilo was from EG Norris at 327p/kg, and N Griffiths again impressed, taking £153.50 per head.

Finally, the superheavies (52kg+) were a smaller group this week—just 46 forward—but they averaged 268p/kg, with MT Lewis leading the way at 289p/kg and £168.50. Not quite last week's top figures, but demand is still there when the quality is right.

All told, the overall average held firm at 290p/kg, with the SQQ just under at 293p/kg. That's a solid improvement on the softer trade we saw the week before, and it gave vendors more confidence heading into next week.

So, what's the takeaway? If you've got hogs in good order, don't hold back—they're wanted. And if you've got hogs coming fit in the next week or two, give me a shout—I'd be glad to talk through entries with you.

Trade for cull sheep at Shrewsbury saw a noticeable lift this week, with 294 forward—282 ewes and 12 rams—and a much sharper trade across all classes compared to last week's smaller show of 177 ewes and 5 rams.

The ewe average jumped to £155, up from last

week's £153, and it was clear from the outset that buyers meant business, especially for big, well-fleshed types. With more competition around the ring and confidence returning, plenty more could have been sold to an advantage.

Top call in the ewe section went to SP & CP Williams, achieving £265 for a Pure Texel, closely followed by DM & DR Clarke (£256) and NC & JA Fox (£246). JH Jones & Son led the Suffolk crosses at £229, and strong money continued down the list, with several other pens comfortably £220+. Last week's top ewe made £225, so we've clearly stepped up a gear.

It was the big, weighty ewes—particularly Texels and Texel x Suffolk crosses—that saw the fiercest bidding, with many pens comfortably sailing over £200. Good meated Mules were regularly £145–£180, and even those a little leaner but with frame still returned a solid £120–£140. As for the hill ewes—Welsh, Speckled, and Blackface types—prices ranged from £80–£110, steady on the week, with buyers still looking for grazing types as well as meat.

Over in the ram section, we had 12 forward, up from 5 last week, and demand was no less lively. The average came in at £131—a touch back from last week's £150 due to a few leaner sorts—but top prices were still strong: £231 for a Pure Texel from JH Jones & Son and £179 from RS Smith. We could have sold plenty more.

 The message is clear: buyer demand is building week on week, and with more competition ringside, now's a good time to market cull ewes and rams. We're looking for 500 head weekly to meet buyer requirements, so if you've got sheep to go, get in touch.

**SPRING LAMBS**

We had a strong and well-finished entry of 724 spring lambs at Shrewsbury this week, and trade did not disappoint, especially for lambs in the sweet spot of 38–42kg, which flew away in terms of price per kilo. Buyers are chasing those well-fleshed, medium-weight lambs. Lambs in the 39.1–45.5kg range were the standout performers, with 489 head forward, averaging a fantastic 376p/kg. KH & RHO Harding topped the section at 394p/kg, while A Cockayne achieved an excellent £165 per head. If you're finishing lambs in that weight band, now's your moment. The standard weights (32.1–39kg) also saw solid interest, with 219 sold, averaging a very strong 381p/kg. RT Edwards had a cracking run, topping the day at 423p/kg and £156.50 per head. These tidy, well-covered lambs were precisely what the buyers were after.

Numbers were tighter in the heavyweight section (45.6–52kg), with just 16 penned, but trade remained firm. They averaged 305p/kg, with RT Edwards again taking the top spot at 355p/kg, and DM & DR Clarke leading the headage at £167. There's still demand for these heavier types, though the main buzz remains in the midweights.

Across the board, the overall average hit 377p/kg, with the SQQ at 376p/kg—both very respectable figures for this point in the season.

A quick reminder to vendors—please don't mix leaner lambs in with well-finished ones. It pulls down the price on your good lambs and makes life more difficult for buyers. Taking a little extra time to draft them separately really does help your return.

Likewise, if you've got ram lambs (tups) in the batch, make sure they're pulled out and penned on their own. They're often worth more sold separately, and we can market them properly to the right buyers.

It all comes down to presentation—giving your lambs the best chance to stand out. If you're unsure or would like a hand with sorting, just give us a ring—we're always happy to help.

All in all, a brisk and lively trade this week, with strong demand for the right type of lambs—well-fleshed, well-bred, and right on spec. If you've got lambs in that 38–42kg range coming ready, now's a great time to bring them in.

**NEVER HAVE THEY BEEN SO DEAR**, reports of trade easing with the beef price were muted completely by the Shrewsbury weanling section where prices were just epic from the word go.

A few more cows and calves about today, peaked at £2270 for 11-year-old Hereford cows with blue Heifer calves at foot from HT Probert & Sons. A 6-year-old angus cow with 24-day Limousin heifer from D & C Bradshaw returned at £2020 Longhorn cows from the same home £1980., In calf Hereford cows due in the autumn topped at £2650 for P Lee, while the 3 year old Hereford Stock bull from the same home flew to £3500!! Longhorn bulling heifers from Messrs Bradshaw sold to £1880 (3) – **MORE BEEF BREEDING STOCK PLEASE!!**

A small show of bulls today topped at £1250 for a pair of Beef Shorthorns from JR Ford and Daughter, 7mo Angus bulls from DJ Evans of Boycott achieved £820 while a run of Hereford Bulls from WJF Lees from Newport were a tremendous trade with the top pen of 4 at £860 (7mo) with prices for these starting at £600. Holsteins bulls 5mo £450

Into the steers some sucklers from our welsh vendors from the tops peaked at £1480 for SJ & H Smith for an 8mo Charolais, with others from the same farm at £1420 and £1400. WT Davies from LLanbrynmair soared at £1300 for his 8mo Steer. 8mo dairy bred blues to £1220 for JF Robinson, 7mo Blues from PL Francis Leebotwood £1180. 8mo Herefords from R Peat flew to £1180... only 4 steers sold today for less than £1000!!! Remarkable

Onto the heifers where top prices came for sucklers peaking at £1510 for Mr R Shepherd of Montgomery, 1460 for SJ & H Smith, Salers to £1400 for JF Robinson... but without question the trade of the day were the 7-11mo Blue and Limousin x dairy bred heifers. Many of which had been purchased as calves and full credit must go to the vendors to rearing them so well, and purchasing such even cattle! These appealed to an army of buyers which I almost struggled to keep up with leading prices, £1280 (3) 8mo Blue heifers from JF Robinson, £1280 for Blue £1160 (es 12mo from KM Croft, £1150 (5) 7mo from R Shepherd, £930 for Angus from the Same Home, Limousins to £1160 from N & K Unwin only 8mo, Herefords out of Danish Red Cows 8mo to £860 for M & RM Jones.
