Top price cow at £2780 was **RIVERDANE SZ ZOE** fresh with her 2nd giving 38kg she sold for £2780, another 2nd calves from Carwyn James **MEADOWFORT PHARO TESS 10** achieved £2500 and the final cow of the day **WASTHILLS ROYALS ROXY** from Malcolm Trevor Jones flew to £2350!!

Heifers were topped by the very first in the market from B & L Whitfield with **ALDERBARROW ACK CLARA 2 A BEAUT AT £2950** and her trailer mate from Miss Isla Arell **SWEETPEA SKYS THE LIMIT** sold for £2800! All the remain heifers from then on sold from £2000 to £2550 with the exception of one very milky but uneven heifer selling for £1700.

Friesian Cows topped at 273ppk / £2,074.80 for a 6yr old cow from S. J. & M. A. Palmer, Sutton Hill Farm and to £1,884.80 / 248ppk for an 11yr old cow with plenty of weight about in the ring from I. G. & G. M. Evans and Sons, Pendugwm.

Other well weighted Friesian Cows sold to 243ppk / £1,817.64 for a 4yr old from M & J C Gould, Grange Farm.

Overall 15 Friesian Cows Averaged 223ppk / £1,419

AN ABSOLUTELY FLYING TRADE WITH MORE MORE MORE MORE required to satisfy demand. Spirited bidding across all breeds and creeds. A smaller entry today due to the bank holiday, but undoubtedly no shortage of buyers eager for the quality calves in Shrewsbury.

Leading the bulls was a 2mo British Blue from WH Oliver & Son returning at £680, a 6wo Blue bull from Richard Bowlder Ltd, £650, a beautiful 4wo Blue from Will and Gary Davies achieved £615. A 6wo Hereford bull calf from Robert Allcock £570. An exception 26-day old Limousin bull from WG Bebbington £570, with Winsbury Livestock's baby Limousin Bulls selling for £560! Simmental bulls coming down from the Wirral to £540 for DH & JE Morgan, Angus also selling incredibly well 21 days old from Roger Ainsworth £525, 20 Day old from DP Motterhead £505!! John Phillips' 11-day old Limousin Bulls £480!!

Heifers were perhaps more wanted than the bulls, Flying to £570 for a cracking Blue from G&M Povall, £555 for Richard Bowdler with 2 more at £550 from TA Wainwright and GP & JH Mountford. A firecracker Hereford Heifer from JJB Powell £490, some cow making Limousin Heifers to £475 for Winsbury Livestock, Angus to £440 for Roger Ainsworth.

A slightly steadier feel to trade at Shrewsbury this Tuesday, with 469 prime hoggs penned, down on both last week's entry of 554 and the previous 619. That number drop did little to change the tone at the top end of the trade – buyers remained keen for the correct goods.

The lightweights (25.5–32kg) saw fewer this week, with 48 forward averaging 255p/kg, which was a drop from last week's 278p/kg. The top price came from M Cordiner at 269p/kg. These lighter sorts must carry flesh and shape to make the money; plain or underdone lambs were harder work.

In the standard weights (32.1–39kg), trade was back slightly too, with 166 head averaging 275p/kg, compared to 280p/kg last week and 292p/kg the week before that. Still, good lambs found a home, with S Greig topping at 304p/kg and £118.50 per head. That said, last week saw peaks of 322p/kg and £122.50 – so the very best lambs are still worth feeding up properly and taking in when ready.

Mediums (39.1–45.5kg) continue to dominate in both numbers and trade, with 154 sold to average 294p/kg, up from 282p/kg last week, bucking the trend slightly. LJ Jordan topped at 311p/kg, and DW Roberts hit £136.50 per head. While slightly off the dizzy heights of 338p/kg and £146 from two weeks ago, the demand was solid – especially for square, well-finished hoggs with backs on them. This remains the weight range to aim for.

The heavies (45.6–52kg) saw 57 head forward, averaging 282p/kg, a nice lift from 277p/kg last week. Top prices came again from LJ Jordan at 310p/kg and DW Roberts at £151.50. Compared to last week's top of 296p/kg and £147.50, that's a firm trade and proof that buyers are still happy to pay when the lambs have the finish and killing-out percentage.

In the superheavyweights (52kg and over), 25 were forward and averaged 270p/kg, a lift on last week's 246p/kg, though still shy of the highs seen earlier this month. Top per head was a strong £197 from RE & CJ Davies, with DW Roberts taking top p/kg honours. While some of these heavyweights were exceptional, there's no hiding that overweight and underdone doesn't fly – they've got to be in condition to justify their frame.

This week's overall market average was 280p/kg, up from 274p/kg last week, though still a bit behind the 290p/kg seen the week before. The SQQ (Standard Quality Quotation) hit 282p/kg, slightly ahead of last week's 281p/kg. So while things felt steadier, the averages prove there's still plenty of trade for the right lambs.

The key takeaway, repeatedly is this: hoggs must be well-fed and properly finished before coming to market. There's no reward for sending them lean or pushed in before their time. You'll be well paid if they're tidy, square, and carrying cover. If they're lacking, you'll be disappointed.

With strong buyer demand and numbers running short, now's a good time to sell – but only if they're ready. Give them that extra week on good feed if they need it. The buyers are paying for flesh, not frame.

Cull sheep numbers were back slightly on the week, with 259 head forward compared to last Tuesday's 273. That said, there was no drop in demand — in fact, trade could be described as even firmer, especially for strong, well-fleshed ewes which buyers were keen to get hold of.

Ewe averages held nicely at £145, just shy of last week's £149, but very respectable given a few more commercial and plain types among the entry. The standout sheep still made the money, and the better continental ewes again stole the show, with PW Poole's pure Suffolk topping the day at £241. Not far behind were A Goodier and RS & JA Gregory, with quality ewes into the £220–£227 bracket.

Compared to last week's peak of £259.50 for Charollais ewes from RS & JA Gregory, today's top wasn't relatively as high, but that reflects more on the sheep forward than any dip in trade. The Texels, Charollais and Suffolk-cross ewes with weight and shape still easily cleared £200, with the stronger pens regularly pushing up toward the top end.

Good meat mules were again a solid trade, with many in the £145–£180 range, echoing last week's values. Framier, plainer ewes generally made £120–£140, depending on cover. The hill ewes also sold well, as they did the week before — anything with meat on it, such as Welsh, Speckled, or Blackface types, found ready demand in the £80–£110 bracket. The leaner sorts were still wanted for grazing, and buyers were active across all categories.

Cull rams were a smaller showing again, with just 5 forward this week compared to 21 last week. The average was stronger at £166, up from the previous week's £135, though that's helped by improving quality overall. PW Poole led the way again at £240, with others into the £230s, showing there's still strong interest when the tups have frame and flesh. As ever, more are wanted — it's a solid trade that continues to reward the right kind.

So, although numbers were a little lighter this week, trade didn't take a knock at all, and we could have easily sold another 100 sheep without blinking. The key remains the same: ewes with weight and meat are what the buyers want, and they're still paying well for them.

If you've got cull ewes or rams to move, now's as good a time as any. The demand is genuine, and with entries tight across the board, there's every chance of achieving a premium.

It was another busy day ringside at Shrewsbury, with 623 spring lambs penned for sale — a touch back on last week's 752, but still a strong showing for the time of year. While the overall averages slipped slightly, the mood remained upbeat, especially for those lambs that hit the mark on weight and finish. Buyers are still very much tuned into quality, and if your lambs are coming fit and shapely, the trade is there.

The overall average settled at 340p/kg with an SQQ of 344p/kg, both slightly ahead of last week's 338p/kg and 334p/kg, despite fewer lambs forward. That just goes to show it's not all about numbers — it's about what you're putting in front of the buyers.

Kicking off with the lightweights (25.5–32kg), only a couple went through this week, from SJ Shone, averaging 286p/kg and £80/head. That's back on last week's 307p/kg, but two lambs don't make a trend. Still, it reinforces the message that lambs need flesh, even at the lighter end — buyers will pay for neat, tidy sorts, but lean just won't cut it.

The standard weights (32.1–39kg) brought 98 lambs to the ring, averaging a healthy 358p/kg, which was an improvement on last week's 350p/kg. RS Smith ranked 391p/kg, while JT & AR Frank secured the highest per-head return at £144. That said, last week saw a blistering 423p/kg and £156.50, so while prices eased back from the top end, well-finished lambs still did very well and continue to attract premium bids.

Now to the workhorse section: the medium weights (39.1–45.5kg). With 447 lambs forward, this was where the bulk of the trade happened — and it was lively. The section averaged 340p/kg, slightly up from last week's 333p/kg. S Burnett led the charge at 367p/kg and £153/head, beating last week's top of 345p/kg and matching the leading headage price. These 40-42kg-ish lambs, when right, are still the sweet spot, with buyers competing hard for those that are square, covered, and consistent.

In the heavier lambs (45.6–52kg), 76 head were penned and averaged 322p/kg, improving on last week's 310p/kg. The top price per kilo hit was 327p/kg, and the best per head reached £153.50, as claimed by GH Bruckshaw. Compared to last week's high of 319p/kg and £151.50, this is a step forward — proof that heavy lambs can do the money, so long as they're not just heavy, but also well-finished.

So, how does it all stack up? Despite the slightly smaller entry, this week's trade felt more level-headed — and in many places, stronger — than last week's. The drop-off in very top prices is less about buyer appetite and more about what was in front of them. Shape, finish and presentation remain king, and lean, soft, or short of conformation lambs saw money slide.

If there's one message to drum home, it's this: do not rush your lambs. Give them the time to finish properly, because lean or poorly presented stock pulls down the price for you and others in the pen. And as always, keep those ram lambs separate — they can sell well, but only if they're drafted and marketed the right way.

The quality today was more viable than recent sale with more “young stores” about dominating the top prices then it goes down to younger and native bred weanlings today with very few is any batches of continentals 7-11mo which had become the bread and butter of the section, could you supply them in a fortnight???

Top price was £3300 for a Limousin Cow with Steer calf at foot from Naggington & Parsons from Market Drayton, a Hereford cow with heifer calve from Robert Allcock achieved £2150.

In the Bulls top price was £1210 for a 12mo Blue bull from Craig Lodge, a pair of Limousin from Barry Woodsford 11mo £980, an 8mo from Brain Price £970. 3mo Angus from ET Tomlinson sold to £570. 8mo Holstein bulls from Willowdean Resources achieved £605.

Steers sold to £1700 for a 13mo Blue from DR James of Llandrinio with £1640 achieved for a ripping Charolais steer from SJ & HJ Smith, 15mo Limousins from R & EM Watson, Hanmer £1590, Heifers from the same home sold for £1430. 10mo Angus from GG Unwin £1100. 8mo Hereford steers from Fred Mountford met the buyer’s approval selling for £800.

3/4mo Blue steers from Mr B Chelmick of Prees sold very well achieving £780 Heifers from the same home at the same age £800

12mo Blue heifers sold to a peak at £1380 for KM Croft, 11mo Herefords sold for £1010 for RA Peate with 10mo well fleshed Angus heifers from ML & SE Jones hit an impressive £980 (3) with 5mo Blue heifers from Messrs Thomas selling to a very pleasing £900, Herefords from the same home peaked at £780.
