As always, the best raced away, peaking in both the cows and heifers for DR & A Higgins & Son Ltd's top quality Bentleyford herd, with their heifer **BENTLEYFORD ALAMATER ROXY** selling for £3250 and their cow **BENTLEYFORD ALADDIN FAITH** Selling for £2980, two first class milkers with balance and quality got the trade that they deserved. Further fresh cows from DC & J Clowes, **WINTERSELL SASSA SPOT** sold for £2420. In the heifers Andrew Shakeshafts **DILANDY PEPPER EVE** achieved £2480. After these, with a few exceptions, the entry consisted of $\frac{3}{4}$ cows and heifers or those in meat withdrawal for one reason or another selling from £1100 to £1520.... All made an appropriate price for the quality.

A pair of heifer calves from Lewis Bros, Llanfyllin topped at £300.

We expect the usual entry and quality to return next week.

Top PPK of the day was at 292ppk for a 32month old Friesian Cow from Mr B. D. & Mrs M. A. Price, The Poplars and top price per head was achieved at £2,103.92 for a belting big 10yr old Blonde X Cow from L. G, D. B. & E. A. D. Davies, Lane Farm.

Top Priced Friesians traded from 292ppk / £1,833, 291ppk / £1,949 to 212ppk / £1,768

Friesians Averaged 242ppk / £1,721

Hefty Herefords topped at 234ppk / £1,656 for a belter of a 6yr old cow from P & E Williams, The Oaks.

2 x Cracking Bulls topped at 238ppk / £2,370 for a 3yr old Hereford Bull from A. J. & E. J. Whittaker, Ivy House followed by an 6yr old Limousin Bull to 219ppk from W. T. Jones, Argoed House.

Then two smart young Friesian heifers from H. Edwards, Hill Farm topped at 290ppk / £1,670 and 288ppk / £1,400.

An improvement in numbers this week with trade holding up very well despite the constant fall in the beef trade. Plenty of demand for all grades with blue bulls averaging £508 and topping at £650 from DF Brassington, while Messrs Abbiss sold a good run of blues to a high of £618. The usual goods from Bowdler Farms Ltd sold over £600 on three occasions, with several £590+

H Edwards stole the show with her Charolais bulls selling at £805, £710 and £700. Lim bulls sold to £545 from RD Evans with the usual quality from Messrs Phillips to £530 and £505.

Natives still an electric trade with Herefords to £540 from Ct pain and Angus to £518 from KW Gunnery.

Friesians to £240 from Messrs Vooght, Buttington Old Hall with all averaging £119.

Blue Heifers well sold topping at £560 from Bowdler Farms with a good run also selling at £555 and £548. Lim Heifers sold to £490 and £480 with an average of £435.

Hereford Heifers sold to £360 from Mr Ainsworth, while the good run of Belted Galloways selling to £298 from CJ Tams, while the bulls sold to £305.

Many more numbers needed for next week please with demand remains so sharp.

A noticeably smaller entry of 253 prime hogs this Tuesday, almost half the numbers seen last week, and a significant drop from the 619 head just a fortnight ago. Fewer hogs did nothing to dampen buyer demand, especially for well-finished sorts, and trade stayed firm overall.

The lightweight hogs (25.5–32kg) were scarce, with just 9 forward this week. They averaged 145p/kg, a significant drop from last week's 255p/kg. The top price came from R Ratcliffe at 272p/kg and £87 per head. It's clear these lighter types really need to carry flesh and shape, or they'll struggle—anything plain or lean is finding it hard work.

Standard weights (32.1–39kg) saw 90 head penned, with trade holding up better than expected. The section averaged 265p/kg – slightly back on last week's 275p/kg – but still respectable given the national picture. J Pugh Ltd led the p/kg at 289, and EG Norris topped the per-head at £110, averaging £103. The right sorts – square, tight-skinned, and carrying cover – were still well sought.

Medium weights (39.1–45.5kg) proved the standout category. This is where the money is and where most hogs seem to be hitting their mark. 75 sold to a top of 332p/kg and £146 per head, both from CP Paddock, with an excellent section average of 280p/kg and £121 per head. Although that's a touch behind last week's 294p/kg average, it's a strong result for fewer hogs and underlines consistent demand for quality.

Heavier types (45.6–52kg) remained solid too. 68 were forward and averaged 258p/kg, back slightly from last week's 282p/kg, but prices per head held up well, averaging £127 with a top of £144 from MT Lewis & Son. R Ratcliffe took top p/kg at 281. These heavier sorts need to be finished and tidy to justify their weight, and those that were sold accordingly.

The superheavies (52 kg+) saw just 11 penned, averaging 224p/kg. While this is well down on last week's 270p/kg average, the top call of 284p/kg and £159 per head (both from CP Paddock) showed that the best still command a premium. But as ever, anything overly heavy and underdone is more complex work – buyers are happy to pay, but only when there's a finish to match the frame.

This week's overall market average settled at 265p/kg, back from last week's 280p/kg. The SQQ was firmer at 272p/kg, nudging ahead of last week's 271p/kg. So, while numbers were sharply down and the top-end trade cooled slightly in places, averages suggest buyers are still actively chasing the correct goods.

The message remains the same: hoggs must be ready. Properly finished, square, and covered hoggs will always find a home. But the trade won't forgive it if they're lean, over pushed, or not quite there. With numbers tightening and demand still solid, it's a good time to sell – make sure they're ready to go.

What a difference a week makes at Shrewsbury! After a solid trade last Tuesday with 623 lambs selling well, today's massive entry of 2,039 spring lambs produced the best trade of 2025 and possibly the strongest spring lamb sale anywhere in the country this week. The quality on offer was consistently high, and buyers responded with fierce competition from start to finish. This was a real step up from last week, both in numbers and prices.

Overall, lambs averaged an outstanding 391p/kg, significantly from last week's 340p/kg. The SQQ also rose sharply to 387p/kg, compared with 344p/kg the previous week. This jump demonstrates that the trade isn't just about numbers — it's about presenting quality lambs that meet buyers' exacting standards. The atmosphere around the ring was electric, with buyers firing on all cylinders and ready to pay for well-finished, shapely lambs across every weight category.

In the lightweight sector, numbers were limited, but trade was notably stronger than last week. M Cordiner topped the prices at 350p/kg and £105 per head, a clear improvement on last week's average of 286p/kg and £80 per head. This proves that even at the lighter end, buyers will reward neat, fleshed, and fit lambs, while leaner sorts struggle to meet the mark.

The standard-weight lambs saw over 630 heads through the ring, and the demand was intense. These lambs averaged 399p/kg, a big rise from last week's 358p/kg. The top price per kilo hit 415p from JN, CG & S Campbell, with the highest per head at £161 from FC Roberts. While last week offered strong prices, too, today's figures outperformed them comfortably, showing that quality and finish will always command premium bids.

The medium weight section was the day's highlight with 1,247 lambs forward. Trade was electric here, averaging 387p/kg compared to 340p/kg last week. Prices peaked at 399p/kg from TH Tanner, and headage topped at £170 from JH Jones & Sons. These 40-45kg lambs are clearly the sweet spot for buyers, who are competing hard for power, shape, and finish. This week's trade was on another level compared to last week's top of 367p/kg and £153 per head.

Heavyweight lambs also maintained their strength, with 139 penned averaging 357p/kg, up from last week's 322p/kg. The top price of 366p/kg came from DI Roberts, while GD Pink led the per-head prices at £170. These figures clearly improve last week's 327p/kg and £153.50 per head, highlighting that heavy lambs still command premium money — provided they are well finished and properly presented.

Superheavies closed the day on a strong note, averaging 300p/kg and reaching 315p/kg from AR Conde. The top per-head price of the day was £185 from R Bowdler, capping off a session where quality truly was king.

In summary, today's trade at Shrewsbury was on fire compared to last week. Prices rose sharply across the board, reflecting the lambs' high standards forward and buyers' keen appetite. While last week saw steady, upbeat trade, this week delivered a spectacular performance. The message remains clear: finish your lambs properly, don't rush them, and keep presentation tight. Those who brought well-shaped, fleshed lambs were rewarded with brisk bidding and excellent prices. For those with lambs ready, now is the time to get them to market. The trade is here and waiting.

Cull sheep numbers were up this week, with 338 head forward compared to last Tuesday's 259. Despite the increased entry, demand remained strong and trade was lively throughout. While the average for ewes dipped slightly to £142 from last week's £145, this was

mainly due to a higher proportion of leaner, commercial types in the mix. Nonetheless, all types sold well, and more stock could easily have been sold to advantage if available.

The standout ewes with size, weight, and good meat content continued to attract the best prices. Charolais, Texel, and Suffolk ewes regularly exceeded £220, although this week's top price of £220 was slightly lower than last week's peak of £241 from a Suffolk ewe. The top Charolais and Texel ewes sold well but didn't match last week's highest levels, reflecting the quality and type of stock forward rather than any weakening in demand.

Heavy, well-fleshed ewes, especially pure Texel and Texel-cross Suffolk types, made consistently strong money, often surpassing £200, just as they did last week. Good meat mules remained steady in the £145 to £170 range, close to last week's £145 to £180 bracket. Plainer but well-framed ewes generally sold for £120 to £140, again mirroring the previous week's prices. Hill-bred ewes such as Welsh, Speckled Face, Scottish Blackface, and Swaledale continued to attract steady demand, trading between £80 and £110.

Cull rams saw a slight increase in numbers compared to last week's five, with 13 forward this time. The average price for rams was £138, down from £166 last week, which reflects the variation in quality rather than demand. Top rams still commanded strong prices, with the best reaching £213 for a Beltex from CP Paddock. Buyers remain keen for well-finished rams; more entries are wanted to meet this demand.

In summary, although more sheep were offered this week, the trade remained firm and steady. The key message is unchanged: well-finished, heavy ewes and rams are in demand and rewarded with strong prices, while leaner or plainer types sell at a discount but still find buyers. The highly anticipated sale of the Lilleshall Herd of Pedigree Holsteins attracted buyers from all across Wales and into the Midlands and down to the Southwest to Shrewsbury Auction Centre on Friday 30 May 2025.

The herd has been lovingly built over 25 years, with Philip having a real love for red and white cows which proved to command the highest prices throughout the day. One of these prudent investments was Hayvalley Jordy Rae Red EX91, purchased in 2020 she was flushed to Koepon Shield Red, resulting from the flush were 7 1st or 2nd lactation cows and heifers which on the sale day averaged £3728. The Sale topper was **LILLESHALL SHIELD RAE RED 11 ET VG85**, our inside cover girl, a picture of near perfect balance and power commanded huge interest before levelling at 5000gns head to purchasers of many of the top sellers on the day Messrs SB farms, Haverfordwest. Next in the prices was another Red Heifer, **LILLESHALL ELEVATED RHAPSODY RED 5 VG85**, her 4th dam being the all-conquering "Tank", herself a stylish Red Heifer achieved 4900gns purchased by Obsidian Holstein, Stafford. Next in the prices was the one-month fresh **LILLESHALL SHEILD RAE RED 8** which continued that family's success on the day at 4600gns for B & El Carr, Worcestershire. Her heifer calf by Peak Altalionme topped at "a" lots at just 32 days old selling for 1000gns!!

A very satisfying 4100gns was achieved by the 4th lactation **PEAK RUBELS RHAPSODY EX92**, who was dam of the Elevated Rhapsody mentioned above. Also breaking the 4000gns barrier were 2 fresh heifers from the Avis Family **LILLESHALL RUBELS AVIS B 55 VG 86** and **LILLESHALL ELEVATED AVIS B RED 56**, Both purchased by SB Farms. Dry cows were in strong demand to peak at 3400gns for **LILLESHALL SHEILD RAE RED 6**, Who was in calf to the Angus for June, over 20 dry cows sold for 2500gns or more!!

The youngstock at the sale were simply incredible and rarely if ever has a group of such well-bred and reared youngstock been offered in an Auction. The in-calf heifers sold to levels never seen before, topping at 3700gns for **LILLESHALL MCDONALD P ZANDRA 7**, Bred from the Woodmarsh line of the exceptional family due to Peak Altaindigo on the 1st July, at 3600gns was **LILLESHALL ELEVATED HELENE RED 44**, another stunningly beautiful heifer by Elevated red who really had left a mark on this herd, due in June to the Angus. 3000gns was seen on 3 further occasions for the in-calf heifers with the whole offering of 51 in calf heifers from served to due in 28 days achieving an average of £2497!!

The bulling and Maiden Heifers were another incredible trade, the section included heifers due to be served and those just over 6 months old, only 4 out of 62 sold for less than 1000gns!! Top prices sailed to 2000gns for **LILLESHALL RANTON MELODY**, one of the very last heifers in the catalogue born 20th October 2024. 1900gns was seen twice, firstly for a yearling, **LILLESHALL ELEVATED ASHLYN** and then for **LILLESHALL RANTON LILA Z RED** born 13th September 2024. The demand for these heifers was incredible and flew and the ringside remained busy right to the very end of the sale!!

The dairy equipment met very readily bidding at ringside and online with the, 2011 Lely Robots topping at £10200, 12000litre Bulk Tank £6500, 1 2011 Lely Juno £4000, Leley Plate Coolers £2800, Fullwood Icebank £2800

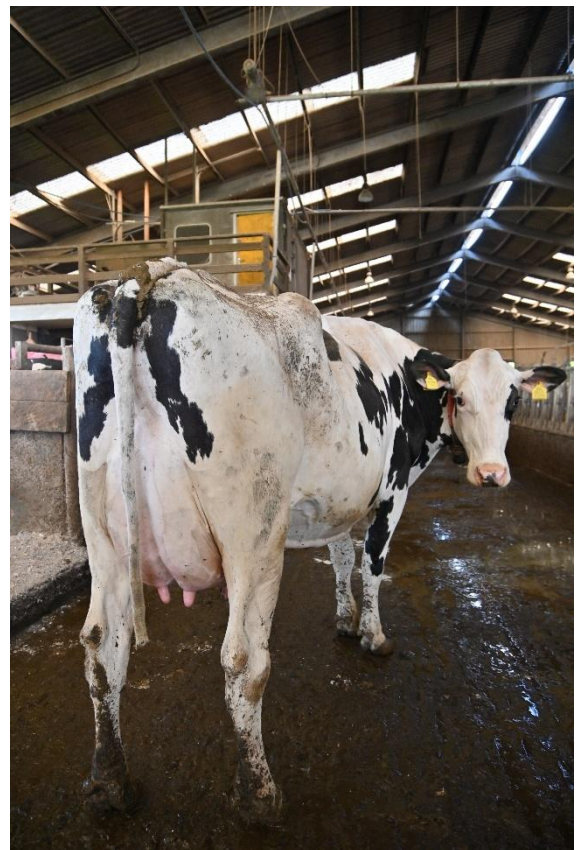
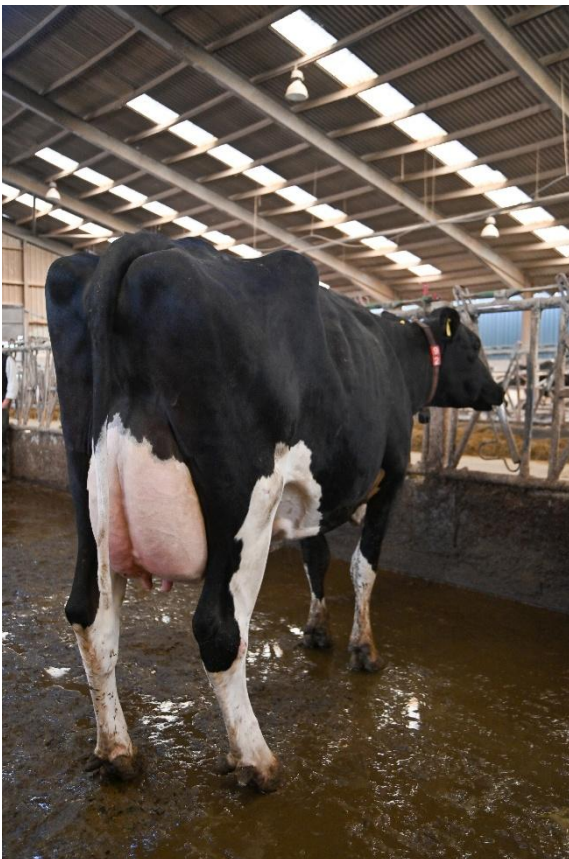
